ITS GOAL IS TO INCREASE INTERNATIONAL UNDERSTANDING THROUGH CULTURAL EXCHANGES WITH PEOPLE OF DIFFERENT CULTURAL HERITAGES AS WELL AS TO PARTICIPATE IN AND ENCOURAGE ARTISTIC AND ECONOMIC INDEPENDENCE FOR ARTISTS EVERYWHERE.

IN 2013, THE EEG-COWLES FOUNDATION INITIATED THE CREATION OF THE FRENCH NON-PROFIT **ORGANIZATION C'EST COMMENT** WHICH SHARES THE SAME MORAL OBJECTIVES AS THE FOUNDATION, COORDINATES SOME OF ITS PROJECTS AND FACILITATES CERTAIN OF ITS OPERATIONAL FUNCTIONS OVERSEAS. AT THE SAME TIME, C'EST COMMENT CAN OPERATE INDEPENDENTLY WITH ACCESS TO EUROPEAN AND OTHER RESOURCES.

THE ACTIONS OF THE FIRST 13 YEARS OF THE EEG-COWLES FOUNDATION HAVE BEEN PRIMARILY IN WEST AFRICA, SUPPORTING EMERGING CONTEMPORARY DANCE THERE. OTHER ACTIONS HAVE ALSO INCLUDED PROJECTS INITIATED IN BRAZIL, FRANCE AND THE UNITED STATES. CAPABLE OF ACTING RAPIDLY AND ALWAYS IN CLOSE COLLABORATION WITH ITS PROJECT PARTNERS, THE EEG-COWLES FOUNDATION AND C'EST COMMENT PLAN TO CONTINUE THESE ACTIONS WHICH HAVE A LONG-TERM IMPACT AND NECESSITATE A DURABLE COLLABORATION.

This program offers analysis, both physical and historical, with practice in giving an appropriate class for a given situation. It aims to avoid injuries in teaching dance and to deepen awareness of what traditional and creative dance are about in today's world.

With no money for the trip, the eeg-cowles Foundation was able to pay for the round-trip tickets from Tehran.



SUPPORT FOR SPECIAL PROJECTS AND EVENTS

Since 2010, the eeg-cowles Foundation and C'est Comment have given grants to the **Bougou Saba Cultural Center** in Siby, Mali. The Center is a space dedicated to ecological construction and durable development as well a space of creation, residencies and cultural exchanges, with other villages in the Mandé region, throughout Mali and the rest of the world. They support the preservation of traditional arts thorough dance, music and painting programs as well as linking traditional artisanship with contemporary know-how, whether for making musical instruments or building earthen houses. Their mission is to serve the Mandé region by supporting economic, social and human development by working with local representatives and sensitivity to tradition.

The grants given have gone to organizing various professional workshops in dance with free public showings; the construction of a wooden dance floor; free dance classes for village youth.

In 2016-17, the eeg-cowles Foundation contributed to choeographer Robin Becker's documentary film "INTO SUNLIGHT". The original choreography, of the same name, was based on the Pultizer Prize winning book "They Marched Into Sunlight: War and Peace Vietnam and America October 1967" by David Mariniss. The book focuses on major events in the history of the United States: the Battle of Ong Thanh in VietNam and the anti-war demonstrations at the University of Wisconsin in Madison. In the Fall of '67, two major battles are fought in these two places.

In 2014, the Bougou Saba Cultural Center, situated at the entrance into the Mandé region, initiated an artistic and cultural event called Bogo Ja. Based on the then disappearing traditional art of painting houses to mark important rites of passage during the year, this event, now a competiton, has revived local, regional and international interest in the community of Siby, 40 kms from the capital of Mali, Bamako. The women are the ones who have always painted their homes and this revival has contributed to the recognition and valorization of their skills, as well as to their cultural and economic standing. It has become a busy time, enlivening the whole village, with additional events including dance, song, theatre and puppets, in traditional as well as contemporary expressions.

This year, the Bogo Ja Festival is taking a bigger step towards the cultural and economic development of the village by hosting the first F.A.C.T. - FORUM d'ARCHITECTURE CONTEMPORAINE en TERRE (Forum on Contemporary Earthen Architecture). Inspired by current research and innovations in earthen construction world-wide, linking historic methods with modern knowledge of ecological durability, the goal of the forum is to sensitize the population of Siby and government authorities to the contemporary value of their traditional methods in today's world. The multiple advantages of earthen architecture will be exposed, including the necessity of an environmentally sound perspective for the future, all of which will contribute to the economic and cultural benefits for everyone in Siby.

The eeg-cowles Foundation and C'est Comment are giving additional financial support to the Bogo Ja Festival this year for the organization of the International Forum on Earthen Architecture (**F.A.C.T.**) and for participation in the International Congress Terra which took place in Lyon, France, the summer of 2016.
